Peter Malinauskas, re the ongoing manufactured Covid crisis, why is SA Health not addressing the obvious issue, which is that people are living longer, but not necessarily healthier lives? As a consequence there's a growing burden on the health system, which is falling badly behind.

Why on earth are services not being expanded in order to meet this increased demand? Instead, the lives of the young - and also the economically productive - have been restricted to (purportedly) protect the elderly...this is insane and not sustainable. We won't have a functioning society or economy if this madness continues.

Older people are demanding more of the health system - how are we going to pay for this, particularly if governments continue to damage the economy as they have done with the response to Covid-19? There isn't a bottomless bucket of money. How much can people expect out of the health system in their lifetime, and how much should they contribute?

It's way past time for a broad look at the health system. Unfortunately the bureaucrats, politicians and academics in situ at the moment do not appear to be up to the task, with their myopic focus on failing 'vaccines', and over-use of testing. How much money has been squandered on the grossly disproportionate and ill-targeted Covid response? Who are the real beneficiaries of the grotesque expenditure of billions of taxpayers' dollars on masking, mass testing, coercive mass vaccination and digital tracking of the public across Australia?

SA Health System in Chaos - notes from an insider (10 July 2022)

- We are two and half years into a pandemic and the hospital system is now worse off than ever before.
- The general population has very little idea of what is really happening in the health system. They are systematically being lied to by the government and media. Health staff are either too afraid to speak out or gagged in expressing the truth about what is happening on ground level. This needs to be uncovered and full transparency offered to the public. The situation is critical from a physical, emotional and monetary perspective.
- Overburdened, understaffed and huge wastage of resources. Emergency departments are overwhelmed with limited ward beds for patients. Patients are lying in makeshift areas with no showers or adequate facilities for days on end because ward beds are unavailable.
- The system was in chaos before covid, but the situation is now amplified by many factors, including patients unable to be discharged home or to community facilities due to lack of onward available beds or carers to support individuals. Poor planning by government has created a knock on effect in every sector for a completely unprepared system.
- Many people are admitted to hospital with minor covid symptoms due to social situations, i.e. cannot isolate on their own / lack of carer support. This causes many unnecessary 'social' admissions, further adding to bed pressures. Patients with multiple co-morbidities and an ageing population are also major reasons for admission. Covid has just compounded the fractures in the system.

- Covid mandates are still in place causing constant staff shortages. Staff have left the system due to the ongoing mandates. Existing staff regularly do overtime and double shifts. Hospitals are relying on agency staff to fill in staffing gaps. This is causing a massive cost blowout.
- Currently the system is in gridlock due to the problematic Covid response, with elective surgery being cancelled in the public system. Public patients are being diverted to private hospitals to have surgeries at the taxpayers' expense. With the public system currently cancelling elective surgeries and services, casual staff are leaving the public system and working elsewhere due to limited work available.
- Constantly changing and confusing covid rules which are different in every sector (community, public and private). Rules are not standardised, limited scientific rationale and change on a daily basis.

Peter Malinauskas, if this insider's view of the hospital system is accurate, it seems 'Covid' is being used to cover up fundamental problems in the health system, which does not appear to be keeping pace with the pressures of an aging population. After two and a half years, how can the system still be such a shambles?

To purportedly protect the hospital system, the health of the entire community is being put in jeopardy with the over-use of medical products, e.g. the Covid 'leaky vaccines' being repeatedly pressed upon everyone regardless of age and health status, along with highly questionable testing and masks. Taxpayers' money is being squandered on defective jabs and testing, money which could have been usefully spent on improving hospital resources.

As happened overseas, the health of the South Australian population is being damaged due to poor management and ill-judged, disproportionate Covid-19 policies, resulting in delayed or inappropriate medical treatment.

'Covid' now dominates everything in our lives, with a constant diet of fear-mongering to depress the population. Where is the encouragement to eat good food, exercise, work, get out into the fresh air/vitamin D, and enjoy social interaction?

Instead, the failing SA 'Health' system is fostering a disaster.
